As part of that reflection I looked back at the minutes of the first time I presided at Annual Meeting here, January 19, 1975, when John Powell was Senior Warden and John Kreutter was Junior Warden. Among the Vestry were Bill Raivel, Leon Anderson, Russell Johnson, John Cox. Jim Diggs was elected at that meeting as were Walt Cuttler and Susan Croft. Oden Bowie, Warden Emeritus, presented me with a gavel made from lumber taken from the Church during the restoration. I used that same gavel to call this year's meeting to order. Tom Jones, Treasurer, gave the financial report. Mrs. J. Glenn Harwood was secretary of the meeting that day.

It is interesting to look back at the minutes of that and other meetings in those days and realize that so many of those leaders are still active in the Parish. Several of the Search Committee members who visited Kathy and me at St. Paul's in Westfield, New Jersey, and subsequently gave my name to the Vestry in 1974, are still active: Susan Croft, Peg Johnson, Oden Bowie.

As to the future, Kathy and I are going to continue to live in Millersville and stay active in the area. We have some travel plans in the near future to the beach in North Carolina with family and to Germany and Austria in the fall. We're going to see what Florida is like early in the next year. I have signed up to do some supply ministry at St. Andrew's, College Park. The Bishop wants me to continue as Diocesan Ecumenical and Interreligious Officer.

These have been wonderful years for us all here at Holy Trinity. I know that with the great leadership you have in the Wardens and Vestry and others the joy of the mission and ministry here will continue into the future as you look forward to celebrating your 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2012. I will miss being a part of this vital Christian community. I will keep in touch. I look forward with a mixture of feelings to the next few months we have together before we say goodbye on June 25<sup>th</sup>. Bless you all.

## Vestry News

Vestry Meeting of March 16, 2006*

The meeting opened with a general discussion of natural tragedies and how the church as a whole should respond.

The next meeting of the ministry clusters will be on Saturday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> in Parish Hall between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. Communications will be the theme. There will also be a review of the reorganization of the clusters.

The Finance Committee stressed the importance of completing forms for reimbursement to members of the congregation. A note will be placed in the Tidings regarding this. A motion was approved to authorize the Finance Committee to move a portion of the Church investments from one group of mutual funds to a better performing group. This was at the recommendation of the financial advisor of the Church (Legg Mason).

The Day School report indicated that the proposed communications tower would not be pursued at this time as a revenue source. Also, the Barr family has stated that they have no present intent to move, so the possible purchase of that property is not in active consideration. Finally, a number of experienced Day School Governors will be leaving the Board for various reasons and there will be a number of vacancies to fill.

The Church sign is progressing and should be done soon.

Bishop Jane Dixon will be visiting Holy Trinity on Sunday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, to celebrate Father Tom's ministry with us.

Also on April 30<sup>th</sup>, we will be joined by Dr. Charles B. Jones, Author of *The View from Mars Hill: Christianity in the Landscape of World Religions*. Dr. Jones will also be a part of our Sunday Discussions the first two Sundays in May. Plan to join us!

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

## **Historic Church of the Holy Trinity Destroyed by Fire**

Early on Sunday morning, March 12, 2006, historic Church of the Holy Trinity in downtown Juneau, Alaska, was destroyed by fire. Nothing is left but the foundation.

Juneau, Alaska's state capital, is a small city of 30,000, accessible only by air or water. The parish community is made up of loyal families who are now represented by the third and fourth generation. The church was not only a focal point for the downtown community but also a magnet for many of the nearly one million cruise ship passengers who pass through the town every summer who came to worship.

The 110 year old church was not only an historic landmark, but its McPheters Hall was a focus of community activity, hosting a broad range of educational and artistic events. It was the home of Theatre in the Rough, a local Shakespeare-only repertory company, and Opera to Go, as well as concerts, slide shows, and social outreach.

The congregation as been offered hospitality by the nearby Roman Catholic church, but hope to rebuild as soon as possible. The parish is not well-to-do and Diocese of Alaska is one of the most financially challenged in the Episcopal Church.
